## Reflection

### **Witnessing for Christ without counting the cost.**

The parish church which I attended with my family from the age of seven until I left home, and where Richard and I were married, is dedicated to SS Peter and Paul. On Monday (29<sup>th</sup> June) we commemorate the anniversary of their martyrdom in Rome circa 64 AD.

Peter and Paul are often linked together as they played complementary roles in the leadership of the Early Church. Peter witnessing to Jesus Christ as the Son of the living God and Paul developing an understanding of this for new Christians proclaiming that in Christ Jesus *'there is no longer Jew or Greek, slave or free, male or female for all are one.'*

Jesus had asked Peter as the 'rock' on which he would build his church to look after his 'sheep', his followers, as a pastor. Paul, on the other hand, had been dramatically transformed from Saul the Roman military persecutor of Christians into a passionate preacher and missionary.

Both suffered for their faith, enduring shipwrecks, beatings and imprisonment, as, tenacious in their resolve, they responded to the command to *'go into all the world and preach the good news to all creation.'* (Mark 16:15)

***God of Faith help us to share with courage your good news of justice and peace, where peace is built with justice, and justice is guided by love.***
